- C - Circulation




True Medical Emergencies

- Difficulty breathing, shortness of breath
- Chest or upper abdominal pain or pressure
- Fainting
- Sudden dizziness, weakness or change in vision
- Change in mental status (confusion, unusual behavior)

True Medical Emergencies (cont.)

- Bleeding that won't stop

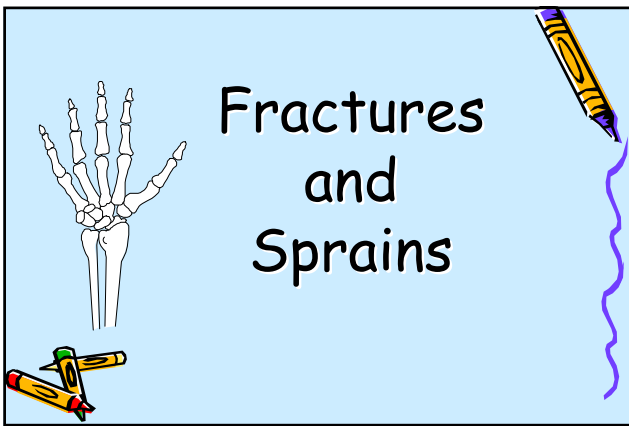


















Head and Spinal Injuries

Seriousness of the Head Injury May Depend on:

- The age of the child
- How far the child fell
- What part of the head the child struck
- What the child struck his/her head on



Head Neck Arm Chest Abdomen

Things to Watch For:

- Level of consciousness
- Vomiting
- Motor function




Signs of Spinal Injury

- Numbness, tingling, or weakness
- Changes in breathing
- Pain with movement
- Inability to move extremity

Signs and Symptoms:

- Hives
- Tightness in the chest
- Difficulty breathing
- Unconsciousness

Things to Remember:

- Remove contaminated clothing

Burns



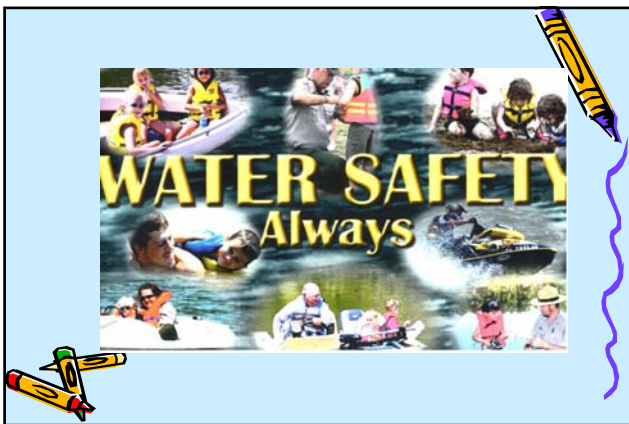
Treatment:

- Stop the burning process and prevent further injury
- Cover burn area with dry dressing
- Monitor airway
- CALL AN AMBULANCE FOR TRANSPORT









